Tuesday 17 January

From dense jungle and European grasslands to coral reefs and Mediterranean seagrass meadows, our network of more than 200 academics assist in developing and leading cutting edge research projects that help to inform local conservation management strategies. More than 600 papers including high impact journals such as Nature and PNAS have been published from these annual programs. The expeditions vary in length from 2 to 6 weeks during the month of June to August.
